Legislative Update

- ▶ House Bill 1106 (2017) Effective Jan. 1, 2018
- ▶ House Bill 1109 (2017) Effective Jan. 1, 2018
- ▶ Senate Bill 2674 Effective March 5, 2018

HB 1106 – Electronic Bidding

Requires all agencies and governing authorities with limited exceptions (entities without high speed internet, counties with population less than 20,000, cities with population less than 10,000) to provide a secure electronic method of receiving bids




 DFA required to set standards for receipt of such bids by state agencies


HB 1106 (Cont'd)



HB 1109 – Consolidation



HB 1109 (Cont'd)

Requires reverse auctions to be the primary method for receiving bids during the competitive bidding process



Specifications

- > Specifications need to be open enough to encourage competition
- Check the NIGP library
- ▶ Call OPTFM
- Other governing authorities

Before the Auction

- Qualify your vendors before they are invited to participate in the auction.
- Do not use their quotes as the only way of setting the auction starting price.
- ▶ Hold pre-bid vendor conferences.

Options for the Vendor

- Vendors must have a way of participating if they chose not to participate online.
- Must have a computer available or someone from the entity will enter the bid for the vendor.
- Reverse Auction is not required to be conducted online.
- Vendor should alert the governmental entity if they will be attending in person.

Reverse Auction Exemptions

Purchasing entities must seek PPRB approval for exemption from using reverse auction as method of procurement.



PPRB must approve any contract entered into by an alternative process.

- Questions How many vendors did you notify? How many vendors have bid in the past? If you have trouble getting responses, are your specs restrictive?


